Regardless the form, the mentorship is always a meeting between two people, a social process and a developmental opportunity for both the mentor and the mentee.

The mutual benefit of mentoring will be the focus of this conference. The conference will highlight mentoring for different target groups and also explore the societal benefits of mentoring.

The mentoring conference is arranged by the newly started *Nightingale Mentoring Network* and hosted by Malmö University. The conference is based on the experiences of The Nightingale mentoring programme which started in 1997 in Malmö for students and children. The Nightingale has spread to many countries throughout Europe and the model has also been developed to cover different target groups (read more: www.mah.se/nightingale).

- To increase the knowledge about mentoring
- To explore the mutual benefit of mentoring
- To exchange experiences and share good practice

Contents of the conference

The conference will include plenary sessions and smaller workshops. The morning will feature key note speaker Amos Carmeli, national director of the Perach mentoring programme which started in Israel 1972. The afternoon will be divided into four workshops focused on different aspects of mentoring.
